RESOLUTION



The 9th Korea-Russia Youth Dialog,

Held in Moscow, the Russian Federation, from February 6-12, 2019,

Guided by the principles and ideals stipulated in the United Nations Charter (UN) (1945),

Recalling the UN General Assembly resolution 70/129 of 17 December 2015, entitled “Integrating volunteering into peace and development: the plan of action for the next decade and beyond”, and the resolution 73/140 entitled “Volunteering for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development”,

Realizing the importance of the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and accomplishing the SDGs by 2030 are crucial for our future generations,

Stressing the significance of volunteering for the UN SDGs in order to achieve the universal well-being,

Acknowledging the necessity of sharing the volunteering experiences between our countries in order to encourage volunteer movement,

Recalling the positive impact of the previous resolutions of Youth Dialogue of the KRD from 2010 to 2017,

Emphasizing the importance of maintaining harmonious relations and developing sustainable cooperation between our nations,

Recognizing the need of constant socio-economic and cultural exchanges between our countries,

Addressing the Republic of Korea and the Russian Federation to fully abide by the following resolution,

The 9th Korea-Russia Youth Dialog,

Commends to incorporate volunteer movement at various levels and stages,

Endorsing governments of the Republic of Korea and the Russian Federation, in partnership with United Nations entities, foster volunteering projects and programs at regional, national and international levels,

Encourages government units and organizations to create a pool of volunteers thus in the future they may work for social institutions and assist in expert evaluation of the ongoing and prospective programs and projects,

Requests governments of the Russian Federation and the Republic of Korea to elaborate statutory instruments to regulate volunteer activity in the areas such as waste management, HIV, diabetes and obesity,

Encourages the conduct of short-term programs among students related to accomplishing UN SDGs in the Republic of Korea and the Russian Federation,

Welcomes sincere participation of people from both countries in volunteer activities,

Emphasizes the necessity of respecting cultural differences while motivating the locals in both countries for the successful accomplishment of the UN SDGs,

Recommends integrating best volunteer practices in the sphere of youth policy,

Proposes to form a common motivation system for volunteers which takes into account the specifics of each country,

Recommends attracting volunteers to participate in addressing such urgent socio-economic issues mentioned above,

Encourages healthcare, ecological and waste management organizations to be actively involved in volunteer initiatives,

Recommends the universities of both countries to credit the volunteer experience of students,

Proposes to provide free educational programs (health, culture, agriculture, management) for volunteers to increase their competence and proficiency,

Encourages volunteers to help promote local industries thereby building infrastructure and to increase average income of the community.
